



Formed in 2013 by harpist Hila Ofek and saxophonist Andre Tsirlin, Duo Duor (formerly known as the Jerusalem Duo) is considered one of the most exciting and unique ensembles in today's chamber music scene.

Since its debut, Duo Duor has captivated audiences worldwide and performed at renowned venues such as the Berlin Philharmonic and the Laeiszhalle in Hamburg, as well as at major international festivals.
